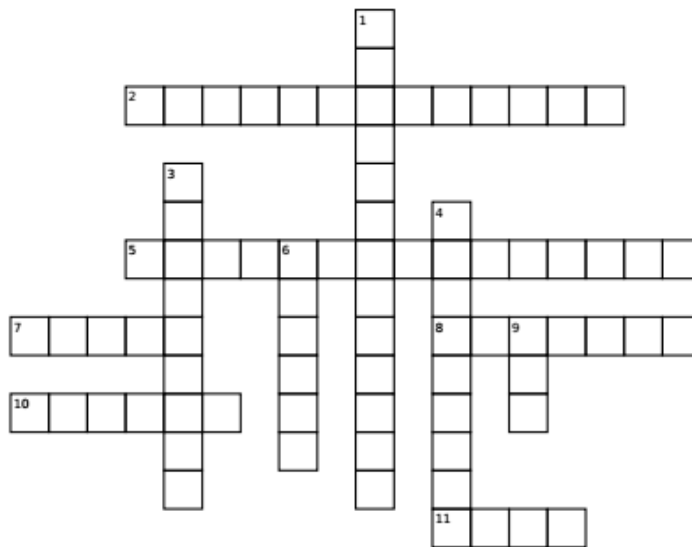

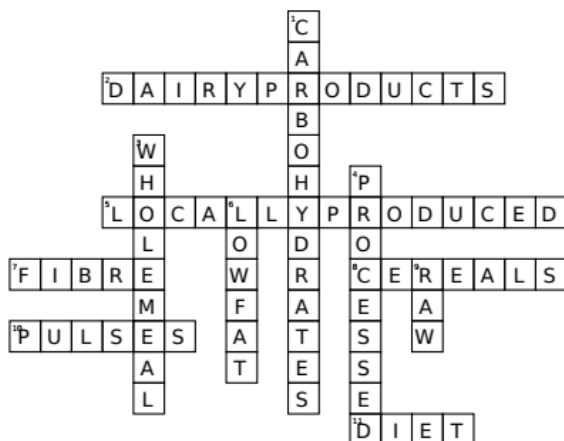

- 1 The racial wealth gap is a measure of white and African American family income.
- 2 In 1865, the Civil War ended, and slavery was abolished.
- 3 Median income of white households: \$171,000
- 4 Median income of black households: \$17,600
- 5 In order to live in freedom, the black community demanded land. According to the Special Field order No. 15, each family was given 40 acres of land.
- 6 In 1929, the government eased the burden of debt. As a result, home ownership became synonymous with the American Dream. Black people were seen as a threat to house prices as property values immediately fell. Consequently, neighbourhoods for black people began to emerge.
- 7 In the 1990s, the mortgage market was opened up to black people. This increased black home ownership. However, black people were admitted to subprime loans with worse conditions.
- 8 It has to do with how they spend the money. Black people are more likely to provide financial help to family members.
- 9 A wide range of factors contribute to the perpetuation of the wealth gap: long-term investments and compound interest, black unemployment due to racial discrimination, housing discrimination, legal discrimination (laws excluding black people from building wealth); segregation in jobs, schools, home ownership.
- 10 Reparations for the slavery of African Americans could help close the racial wealth gap.
