Announcer: The history of Coca-Cola. Listen to Tanja Kugler and put the pictures in the right order.

Tanja: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the Coca-Cola company. My name's Tanja Kugler and this morning I want to tell you about the history of Coca-Cola.

OK. Well, perhaps you know this man already? His name is Dr John Pemberton, and he invented Coca-Cola. Dr Pemberton was a pharmacist in Atlanta, Georgia, in the USA. He made the first Coca-Cola there in 1886. Dr Pemberton invented the drink, but he didn't invent the name. His assistant, Frank Robinson, invented the name Coca-Cola. And he wrote the words for Dr Pemberton too. We use almost the same famous Coca-Cola design today.

Dr Pemberton didn't sell very much of his new drink and after three or four years, he sold his business to a businessman in Atlanta. His name was Asa Candler. Mr Candler started the modern Coca-Cola company in 1892. He was a very good businessman. After only three years, millions of people in every state in the USA drank and liked Coca-Cola.

At first, people didn't buy Coca-Cola in bottles. They bought the drink in glasses, usually in pharmacies. The famous Coca-Cola bottle started in 1916. Of course, Coca-Cola bottles are almost the same today.

In the 1920s and '30s, the Coca-Cola company started selling the drink in other countries.

In the 1950s, '60s and '70s, the Coca-Cola company started selling its drinks in lots of countries around the world. And it started making new products. It sold the first Coca-Cola cans in 1963. In 1982 came Diet Coke. And so on. Today, the company sells its products in over 200 countries, from China to Canada and Australia to Austria.
