anger	red face/neck, show teeth, fists, body leaning forwards/invoke other people's space, use of aggressive body language (e.g. sudden or loud movements)
surprise	raised eyebrows, open eyes and mouth, body leaning backwards,
happiness	relaxed muscles, smile, open body language
sadness	body drops downwards, flat tone of voice, cry
fear	white or pale face, dry mouth, lick lips or drink, don't look at other persons, shaking voice, make errors when we speak, fast pulse rate, (cold) sweat, tense muscles, irregular breath, we change body position a lot, defensive body language (e.g. crossing arms)
